

Halit #1 BE Proactive


You Choose

Habit #2

Begin with the END in Mind!

Envision with the mind what you can't see with the eyes.





Artists are visual.

- If it is not in front of us it is gone.
- When we file it away, it goes out of our radar.




BE REALISTIC



Former soldier turned artist developed a war room with a strategy plan for his art.

He posted his goals mapped on the wall as if going to war.



Don't do everything that comes your way.

Painting needs to come first. Develop habits to keep you on track.



STUDIO HOURS

Every successful artist has studio hours. Set your hours and don't get side-tracked. Plan like you would for a 9 to 5 job!

Balance your time in the studio with your time marketing.

It takes a lot of work to succeed.



Habit #3

Put first things first

Not like Frances Bacon!!





Manage the **TIME**

A good calendar with commission deadlines, shows, one year out at least.

Don't miss deadlines
Record it on next years calendar
so you will not forget.

Write out a schedule.



Habit #4 Think WIN/WIN

Watch for pitfalls...

- Life is a cooperative arena not a competitive one. Mutual benefit is of great value.
- Hoarding causes stagnation, Giving brings life!!





Verify & validate

Give guarantees on commissions





• Ask for workshop reviews, testimonials, ask people to share on Facebook. They don't think to do it so ask.

Reputation

• Send thank you notes... People will remember you. Galleries, customers, students... when they think of you will smile!
The manners your mom taught you are a rare thing in today's email/texting

culture.



Prepare ahead!

Don't underestimate the power of a positive reputation.

Keep note cards (that feature your paintings) by your desk with stamps so they are right there.



Habit #5

Seek first to understand and then to be understood



People often filter everything through life experiences, personal frame of reference... often think they know what you mean before you finish talking.

Be careful to avoid miscommunication regarding commissions and workshops!

Listen, verify and validate. Take steps to protect you both.

Habit #6

Synergize

Two heads are better than one

Don't Isolate!!!



• Two heads are better than one. Expertise, experience and discovery. It is easy to get in your own solitary world. Meet for lunch every month or conference call with other artists. Schedule a small group show, meet people beyond your circle, comment on blogs, share on facebook, join societies, like Mentor Mondays. Get out there.
